DOES YOUR GROUP HAVE A CENTRAL SERVICE REPRESENTATIVE?

The Los Angeles Central Service Committee (C.S.C.) was created in 1943 by A.A. members and oversees the operation of Central Office. The Central Service Representative (C.S.R.) is the link in a chain of unity connecting the individual members of an A.A. group to the C.S.C. and Los Angeles Central Office.

C.S.R.s bring suggestions and input from their group to their monthly Zone meetings. Each Zone's C.S.R.s select a Zone Delegate and Delegate Alternate. One vote for each Zone is counted at Central Service Committee meetings held at 7 PM the second Thursday of the month ten months of the year at Central Office.

Central Service Representatives speak for their meetings at the bi-annual Intergroup gathering held in May and November, C.S.R. votes are counted there. The Intergroup Association is responsible for furthering the affairs of Los Angeles Central Office in accordance with the A.A. Traditions and Concepts.

C.S.R.s report back to their Group with updates and information after their monthly Zone and Intergroup meetings.

C.S.R.s also help gather contributions for Central Office during Gratitude Month.
